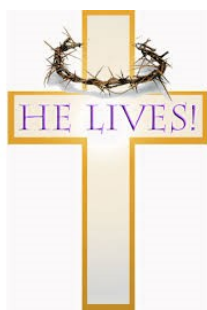

Dear Parishioners,

I am writing to give you an update on where things stand regarding our current situation. From the onset, we realized that the way we respond to the needs of our people would evolve over time. In all of this, we are making every effort to counter the difficulties brought on by the pandemic as devout believers and responsible citizens. These directives replace those previously issued. The Governor's stay-at-home order has been extended through the month of May. (continue on the next page)



The suspension of the public celebration of Masses (except as indicated below) remains in effect. Those who have the capabilities of doing so are encouraged to stream their Masses and devotions. In counties where marriage licenses are being issued, priests and deacons may witness those marriages (either with or without a Mass), assuming of course that all of our requirements for marriage have been satisfied. As per the Governor's Order, no more than ten people may be present and the norms related to social distancing must be observed. Pursuant to the Governor's Order, funeral service may take place (COVID-19 Executive Order No, 8:12, w). If such funerals take place in a church (either with or without a Mass), no more than ten people may be present and the norms related to social distancing must be observed. Not all funeral homes are offering the option of having services conducted at their location, but in places where they are, priest and deacons are free to lead such funeral services. Pastors have the discretion to decline requests to have funerals in their parish church and may instead require that the funeral rites be conducted entirely outdoors at the cemetery. All clerics have the option to decline requests to conduct funeral services indoors at this time. In cases where baptism cannot prudently be delayed, priests are to contact my office for further instructions. Confessions may continue to be heard outdoors. The directive previously issued regarding pastoral care of the sick remains in place. Directives regarding Confirmation will come out at a later date.
